Dear Ms. Arsenault and NOSB Members,

CCOF (California Certified Organic Farmers) thanks the National Organic Standards Board (NOSB) for the opportunity to comment on the Livestock Subcommittee's proposal to remove ivermectin from the National List.

CCOF is a nonprofit organization founded in 1973 that advances organic agriculture for a healthy world through organic certification, education, advocacy, and promotion. CCOF is based in Santa Cruz, California, and represents more than 3,000 certified organic members in 42 states and three countries.

For the fall 2015 meeting, CCOF submitted comments that explained that livestock producers use ivermectin as a last-resort, emergency treatment only when preventive management has not succeeded in protecting an animal from parasite infestation. The petition notes concern about ivermectin's impact on dung beetle populations, which was a concern also raised at the fall 2015 meeting. However ivermectin is not used routinely; its rare use for emergency situations should not threaten dung beetles.
